11. The OGH

The only 5 star hotel on the island, previously serving as the official residence of the Governor of Guernsey. Renowned for panoramic sea views, beautifully designed interiors, rich history and perfect for an afternoon tea or authentic Indian curry.






8. Church Square

Situated at the end of the High Street main shopping area. The Town Church was built over earlier Roman buildings using the spring in Fountain Street.

Site of the closest pub to a church in the British Isles.





4. Fermain Bay

Fermain Valley holds one of the most beautiful tucked away beaches and cafes on Guernsey. The pebbly bay is hidden on the rugged east coast and is a delightful walk from St Peter Port along the cliff path.

10. Boer War Monument

The memorial was completed on 23rd May 1905. It is 18ft 9in tall, weighs 25 tons and bears the names of the 11 officers and 34 men who fell in South Africa.



6. Castle Cornet

This 800 year old castle houses five museums and four period gardens with guided tours and the firing of the noon-day gun.

A bronze statue set on granite. Prince Albert visited the island in 1846.



3. Victor Hugo's House, Hauteville House

For fourteen years, Hauteville House was home to famous French writer Victor Hugo, during his time in exile from France. He spent his time writing his masterpieces, as well as decorating the house.

9. Visitor Information Centre

5. Val des Terres

Opened in 1935, made by workers from the island's long-term unemployed. This winding hillside road is also used for the British Hill Climb Championship with the course record at about 28 seconds. Our Tuk Tuk travels just a little bit slower!





2. Mignot Plateau

The arrival point for cruise ship passengers and used as the terminus for Tuk Tuk tours. Take in the view from Mignot Plateau, across the bustling harbour town of St Peter Port.





12. Royal Court

The is Guernsey's parliament building serving as the home of the Bailiff's Chambers and the Offices of Her Majesty's Greffier and Her Majesty's Sheriff. All criminal and civil court proceedings are held here.



13. Victoria Tower

Offering panoramic views across the west, north and east coasts of Guernsey, this is a great place to capture a stunning holiday photograph.

14. L'Hyvereuse Avenue

The site of Guernsey's last duel with pistols in 1795 between two officers. Major Byng was shot dead, his name was carved into a nearby tree.

15. Blue Mountains

A lookout called the Blue Mountains, where you will get the most spectacular view you can ever imagine overlooking St Peter Port and the other Islands including Alderney and Jersey on a clear day.



16. Candie Gardens

The award winning Victorian Candie Gardens offer spectacular views across St Peter Port Harbour and our sister Islands of Herm and Sark.



17. Roundabout Mast

The mast was built on the 60th anniversary of Guernsey's Liberation Day in 2005. It echoes the maritime links of the Island including the Battle of Trafalgar, where 29 Guernseymen served.

18. QE 11 Marina

A vast array of many luxurious, local yachts and motorboats. At just 28 miles, the Normandy peninsula isn't far away.



19. Liberation Monument

Built exactly 50 years after Liberation from German occupation on May 9th 1945. On this day the monument casts a shadow along the inscribed seating pinpointing events from that day as they unfolded.

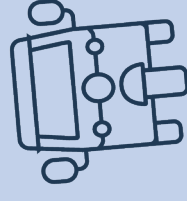
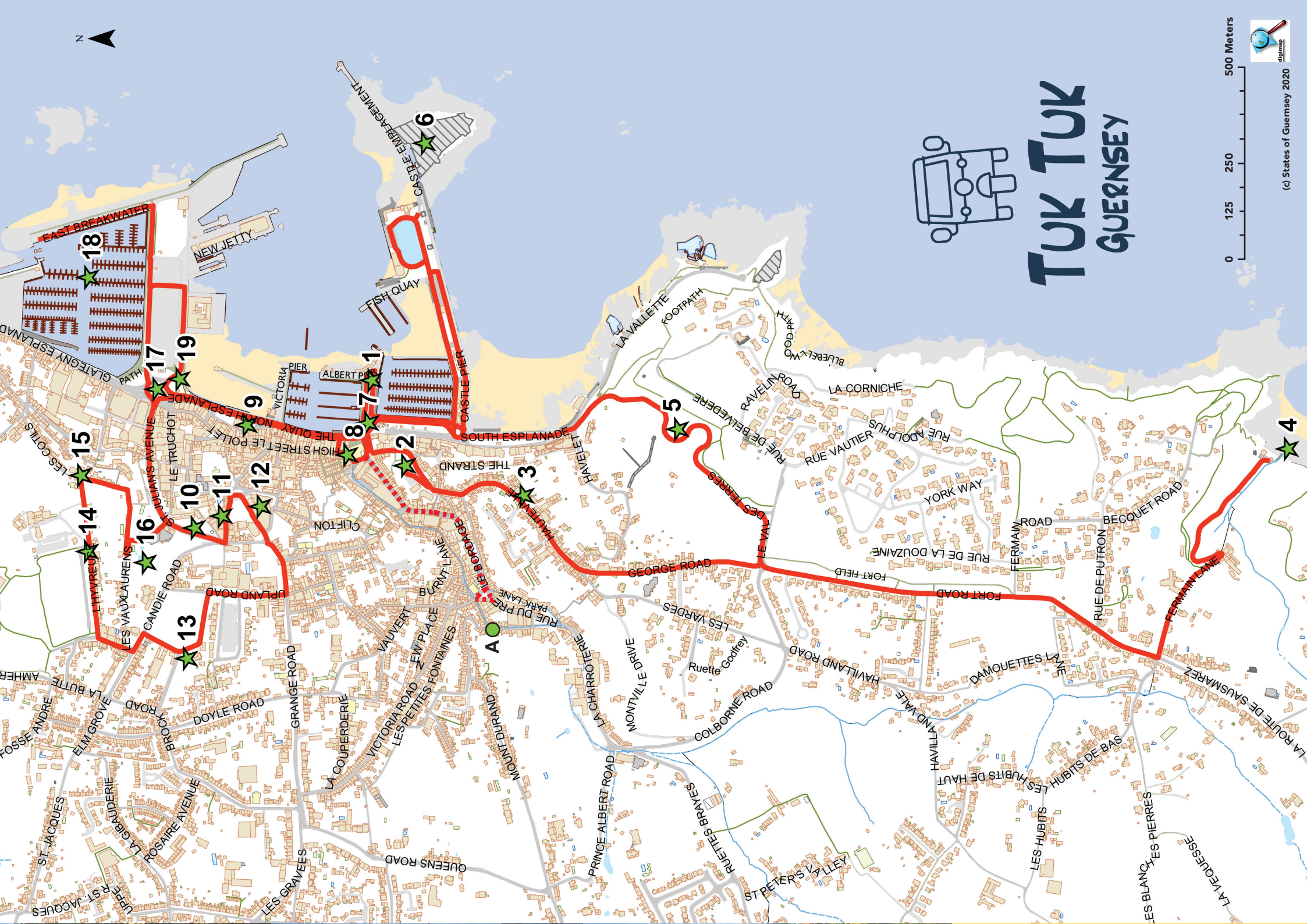


A. Trinity Square
